Incident Details:

This morning, FAU Police received notification from the Broward College Department of Safety, Security and Emergency Preparedness that a rape was reported to have occurred inside the men's locker room of Building 10 on Central Campus at Broward College, on September 12, 2018, between 10:45 am and 11:30 am. It was reported that the suspect followed the individual from the exterior of Building 17 to Building 10.

• The suspect is described as a black male, approximately 19 years of age, short dreadlocks, 5'6" to 5'8", 140lbs, who was wearing purple jogging pants at the time of the incident.

To enhance personal safety, be alert and trust your instincts, especially during the evening hours. Walk with friends or someone that you know very well and let someone close to you know who you are with or what your plans are prior to going out. Do not invite individuals you have only recently met to your rooms and do not accept drinks from someone you do not know and that you have not personally made or opened. We encourage you to look out for fellow owls and call the police department if you witness anything that seems suspicious or concerning.
