To that end and in accordance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act, the following notice of a reported incident is being posted to keep the university community well informed:

REPORTED OFFENSE:

During the evening of Thursday, October 25, 2007, university police received a report from a female student that she had been sexually assaulted by an acquaintance who is a male student. The assault allegedly took place in an FAU residence hall on FAU's Boca Raton campus on Sunday, October 21, 2007. The male student has been identified, suspended on an interim basis and will be trespassed. This matter is under active investigation. As always, it remains the university's policy to fully investigate and report such incidences on a case by case basis.

According to the Violent Victimization of College Students report (Baum & Klaus, 2005) -

- Approximately 15-20% of female college students have experienced forced intercourse (Fisher, Cullen, & Turner, 2000; Koss, Gidycz, Wisniewski, 1987).
- Approximately 5-15% of college men have acknowledged forced intercourse (Koss, Gidycz, Wisniewski, 1987; Malamuth, Sockloskie, Koss, & Tanaka, 1991).
- Rape/sexual assault was the only violent crime against students more likely to be committed by a person the victim knew. Non-strangers committed 79% of the rape/sexual assaults against students.

- * Walk to your vehicle in pairs or in a group.
- * Vary your routine; use a different route, different times.
- * Follow a well-lit pathway or roadway.
- * Be aware of your surroundings. Watch for suspicious people or activities.
- * Be aware of the locations of all telephones on campus and in parking lots. Use them if you are concerned or feel your safety is in jeopardy.
- * When you enter your vehicle, lock all the doors and turn on your headlights. This will allow you to see anyone outside in the dark.
- * If you are unfamiliar with the parking lot, drive through it and check it first. If you don't feel safe, go elsewhere and wait for someone else to arrive.
- * Have your keys in your hand so that you don't have to search for them when you reach your vehicle.
- * When you know you will be returning to your vehicle late at night, try to park in a well-lit area.
- * Before getting into your vehicle, visually inspect the interior for anything suspicious.
- * Report any safety concerns to the University Police Department or the local police department.
- * Do not offer rides to strangers.
- * If you suspect that someone is following you, drive to the nearest open public place, to the University Police or the local police department.

FAU Police Department Cautions About Acquaintance Rape and Date Rape Drugs

The health, safety and welfare of Florida Atlantic University's faculty, staff and students are of utmost importance. To that end, the following notice of a reported incident is being posted to keep the University community well informed:

The Florida Atlantic University Police Department received a report of a possible sexual assault Thursday evening. The victim reported that she had been sexually assaulted by an acquaintance who is also an FAU student on the Jupiter campus. The victim may have been unknowingly given a "date rape" drug. The assault allegedly took place in an FAU residence hall (Jupiter campus) during the early morning hours of Thursday, April 24, 2008. The suspect is known to FAU police and the incident is being actively investigated.

The phenomenon of drugs being used to facilitate sexual assault has been widely reported across the country. Although no confirmed cases have previously been reported on campus, the FAU Police Department urges the FAU community to be alert to the possibility and take steps to protect themselves. Date rape drugs, commonly Rohypnol, GHB and Ketamine, can be slipped into an unsuspecting person's drink. Rapid and severe intoxication follows, along with dramatically reduced inhibitions and memory loss. In this condition, anyone can be extremely vulnerable to sexual assault.

To protect yourself, do not leave drinks unattended and be wary of accepting drinks from people you do not know well. To be even more careful, make sure that you open and pour your own drink, and don't share drinks with others. It is also wise to use the buddy system while socializing - when you go out with friends, agree to keep an eye on one another and to go home together. If a friend starts to exhibit symptoms of date rape drug ingestion, seek medical help immediately. Signs to look for include dizziness and/or nausea, memory loss, breathing or motion difficulties, and acting disproportionately intoxicated relative to the amount of alcohol consumed (non-alcoholic beverages can be utilized with these drugs).
